I don't feel to take your letter too serious Father about thinking of the riches of this earth so much. You have been a poor man all your life, and have missed, one way and another, a lot of things, that you might have had to make life pleasant, and no need to have detracted from your reward in the next life. If one confesses that he must be kept poor and miserable in order to keep humble, then he is

but confessing to the world his own
weakness, and acknowledging that he is not
worthy of greater blessings.

I notice that all the leading church men
are pretty well taken care of, and have got
it by looking out for their material welfare
so. I think that money can come honestly
by keeping the laws of finance as well
as anything else.

I don't see why you should feel that
your boys must follow exactly in your foot-
steps in all things, and as for working
