Descendants of Henry and Sarah Barber Manwaring, pioneers of 1867, formed a family organization at a meeting at the Capitol. Seventy-three attended.

Lorus Manwaring of Salt Lake was elected president, with other officers as follows: Albert Manwaring, Ogden, first vice president; David Manwaring, Rexburg, Ida., second vice president, and Mrs. A. H. Harker, Idaho Falls, Ida., secretary-treasurer.

Temple committee: George Manwaring, Salt Lake, chairman; Levi Manwaring, Provo, and Lucile Walford, Logan.

Research committee: Wilford Manwaring, Springville, chairman; Stella Brockband, Springville, and Marie Anderson, Shelley, Ida.

Meryl Coles and Canna Hill, both of Salt Lake, were appointed historians.

It was decided to hold annual family reunions in Salt Lake and through the organization to bring together several hundred descendants of Henry and Sarah Manwaring, who now reside in various parts of the intermountain country, including New Mexico, California, Idaho, Utah, Colorado and Nevada, with some having moved to Washington, D. C. It was pointed out at the meeting that a number of the family have attained distinction in professions and other fields.
