

## History of Herbert Manwaring

Herbert Manwaring, son of Henry Manwaring and Sarah barber, was born 28 Jan. 1849 in Sandback, England. Joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints about 5 June 1852. Was baptized by Robert Bate and ordained a Deacon under his hands 7 June 1862. Bate was President of that branch at the time—later apostatized.

Herbert emmigrated to Utah April 26, 1866, going to Springville, Utah to a second Uncle, John Faulkner, a shoe maker, for the winter. Moving to Salt Lake the following spring 1867, and working for John Taylor and working for Brigham Young and Madre Root, then going to Cottonwood and hired to Issac Fergeuson, staying till spring of 1868. He then left and went to South Cottonwood and hired to D. C. Thompson and stayed with him eight years, during which time I was stuck down with lighting on 16 June 1870 and stripped of all my clothing and burned considerable. The horse did that I was cultivating potatoes with. I was found by Dr. Harvy Hullinger of Brenton Ward. Restored and carried on a quilt by 4 men and given camphor to drink and administered to by Richard Hare and Charles Wilkins. I recovered and the following spring, by my employer advancing my summers wages, went to Brigham Young and had my folks sent for from England thru the Perpetual Emmigration Fund. They lived in Salt Lake until May 1872 when I moved them to Springville.

On the 22 May 1876 I married Clarrissa Wilkins in the Salt Lake Temple, daughter of Charles Wilkins and Ury Welch of South Cottonwood. We moved to South Brighton. I being one of the first pioneers of what was later Granger Ward with Daniel McRea, Bishop.

In May 1890 we moved to Mapleton, Utah Co., Utah where I labored as ward teacher for about 20 years. Holding the office of Seventy for a few years then being called to office of High Priest. The record being last of my ordination. I also received my second anointing in Salt Lake Temple in fall of 1892 under hands of John A. Winder. We moved to Blackfoot, Bingham Co, Idaho in Groveland in April 1910 where the wife after being sick with paralysis passed away on the 26<sup>th</sup> Sept 1914. My present address is 393 E. South Logan, Utah.
